GSA Funding Options

Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement (JPA) Section 10.07 – Payments To The Agency

All fees, costs and expenses incurred by the Agency may be funded from: (i) voluntary contributions from third parties, such as grants; (ii) voluntary contributions, advances or loans from the Members or other sources; (iii) bond revenue; (iv) taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges levied by the Agency under the provisions of SGMA or otherwise provided by law; and, (v) subject to the unanimous vote of the Board, assessments on the Members to carry out the activities of the Agency generally applicable to all Members.

Need for Rate Setting

- Aside from GSP development, the GSA has operating expenses that cannot sustainably be supported solely by the Member Agencies
- Meet basic operational expenses and of the Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP)
- Applying for Proposition 1 funds to develop Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP)
- Any grant funds received will also require local match

Need for Rate Setting

- Local governments have limited options for raising revenues
- Complex constitutional requirements necessitate a rate study conducted by a specialized consultant
- Staff from all 3 Sonoma County GSAs worked together to interview consultants
- At the November board meeting, staff will make a recommendation that the GSA engage Raftelis Financial Consultants, Inc. for a fee/rate study
